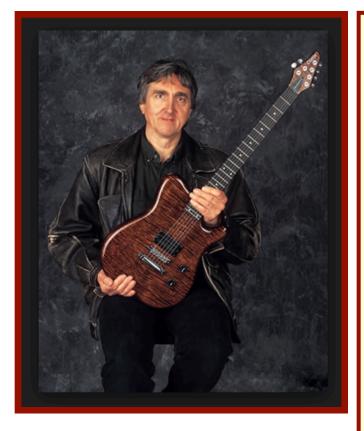

Allan Holdsworth

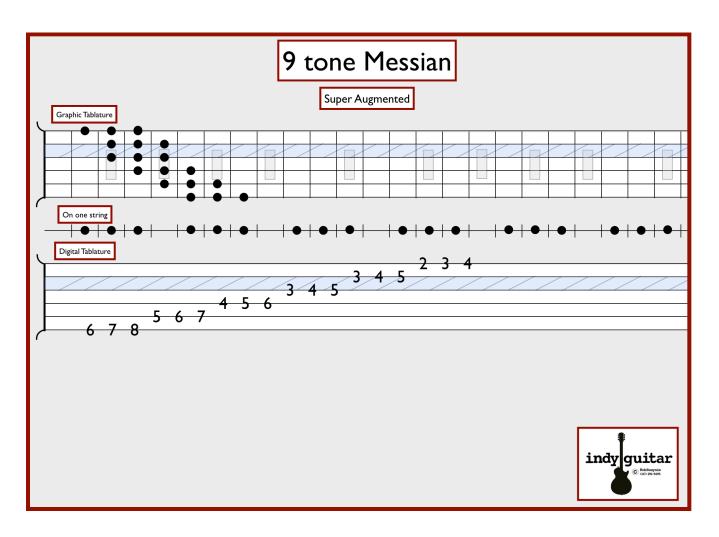

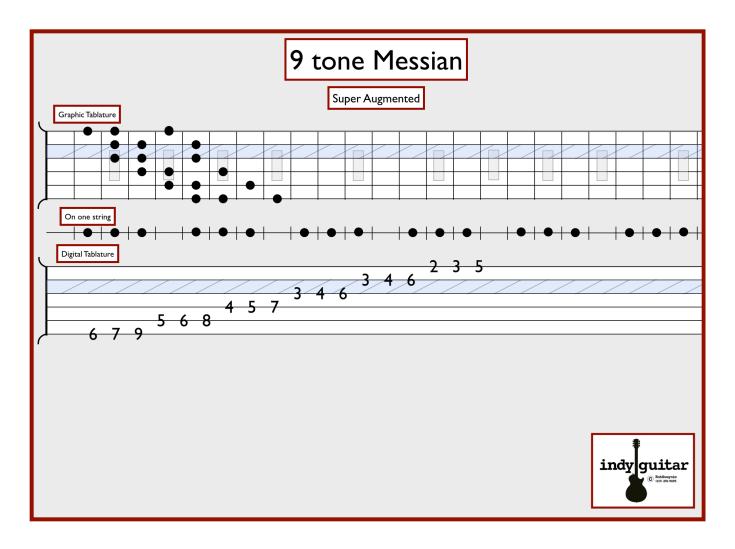
I dreaded this day for many years and now it is here. My hero and inspiration for over 30 years is gone. My only consolation is the fact that his music still lives in digital form and there's enough material in one solo to last me a lifetime of study. I met Allan Holdsworth more than once and he was very humble and modest and bashful.

I gave him one of my bands T-shirts and he acted like he was embarrassed to get a gift. This man plays like no other guitarist and it might take somebody at a certain level to know it. He changes directions motive and rhythmic figure more often than any string player I've ever heard more like horn players such as John Coltrane or Ornette Coleman. It is not just his solo work that fascinates me, his harmonic movements and rhythmic variation are superior to anyone I've heard and I understand he died broke, his friends and fans even kicked in and paid for his funeral. There are no words to say how much knowledge went with this mans dying. I will forever more be thankful that he lived and recorded this wonderful music. He first got me with this solo on "In the Dead of Night" by UK. This issue is dedicated to his life and memory, may he rest in peace.

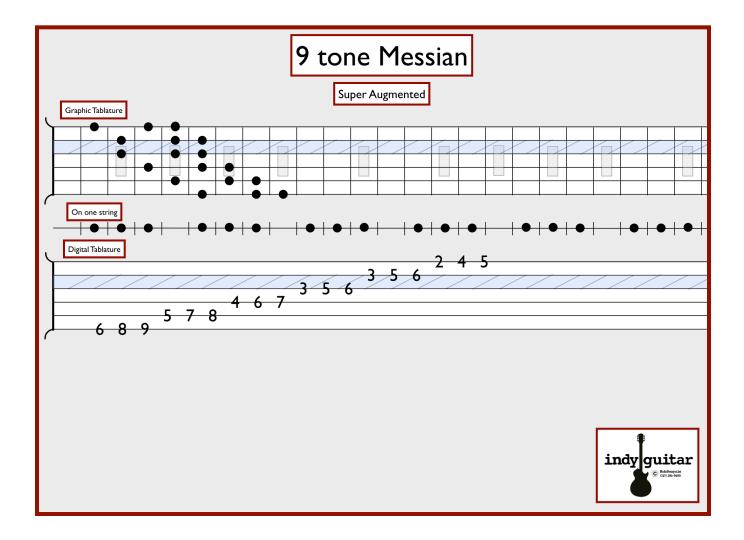

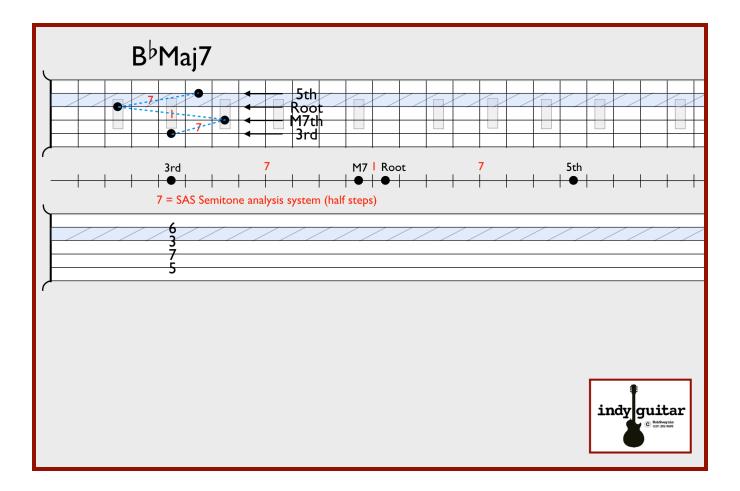
One of Holdsworth's favorite colors was the 9 tone scale catalogued by Oliver Messian and Nicolas Slonimsky. It is a whole tone form with a pass tone connecting every other whole step. It is an augmented dominant sound and Allan used this in many fingerings. Arguably a dominant 7 #11 sound.



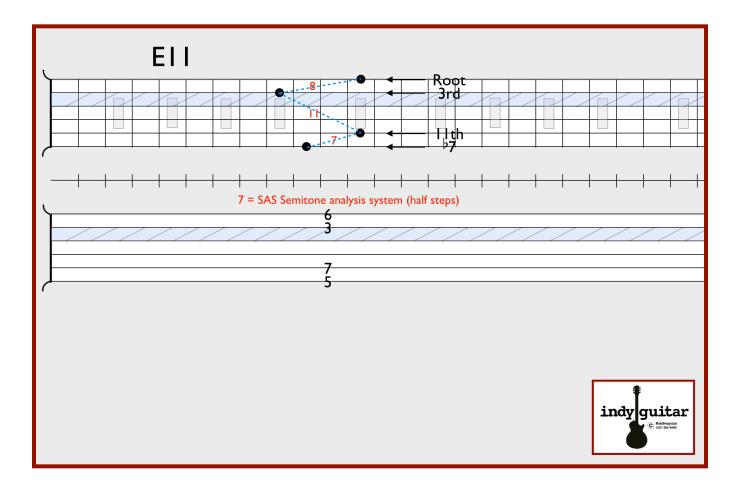
Another fingering



Another fingering

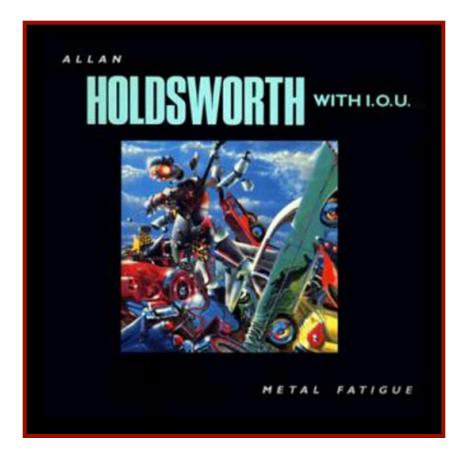


Allan loved chords that had 1/2 steps in them.
